Finding suitable information from the Internet can be tricky for many pupils, especially those lower down in the school. Children are frequently asked to complete research at home, and this can be extremely time consuming and often frustrating as they try to find something which is appropriate to their age and ability.

At St Mary's we currently subscribe to an educational website called Curriculum Visions, which provides a wealth of information about most of the topics which are taught within the school. We have arranged for this website to be available to all St Mary's pupils so that they can use it for finding specific material for homework, or even just to further any interest that they may have developed.

Subjects covered include:

History (eg: *Romans, Ancient Greeks, WW2, Fire of London, Egyptians, Tudors* etc)

Geography (eg: *Weather, Rivers, Coasts, Fairtrade, Environment* etc)

Science (eg: *materials, light, growing, life, forces* etc)

Religion (eg: *Buddhism, Islam, Judaism, Sikhism* etc)

Early Years (*a range of information aimed at early years children*)

Additionally, there are areas covering English, Maths, Languages & Music.

Also, there is a Reading Room containing e-books about various topics and a Museum section for researching a range of subjects.
